Andreas Canyon Loop, Saturday, September 11 at 9:00 AM

This hike is located in the Indian Canyons. The trail follows a stream through a lush area of native California fan palms. The vegetation and surroundings provide a feeling more "Hawaiian" than southwest desert.

Palm Canyon Trail, Sunday, September 19 at 9:00 AM

This trail is located within the Indian Canyons. The hike takes you through the palm covered river bottom of Palm Canyon up into desert plateaus. There are some terrific views of the Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains.


