Russian River, July 19-23, 2006

Come join us as we return to the Russian River for the ninth consecutive year and find out why this trip was featured in the NY Times and remains one of Great Outdoors' favorite summer vacations! Our destination is the quaint little town of Guerneville, a gay/lesbian-friendly respite just north of San Francisco. Join us for a four-night package of non-stop fun and excitement!

We'll be staying at Inn at the Willows, a local lodge with a five-acre camping area on the Russian River. Numerous shops, gay bars, restaurants, and a 24-hour Safeway supermarket are all within walking distance.

Group activities will include twilight kayaking, hiking, and our very popular West Valley winery tour. After dark, we head into town for dinner, fun and dancing! Also close at hand are Goat Rock State Park where the Russian River meets the ocean,

and Bodega Bay, home to Alfred Hitchcock's "The Birds." Or you can just hang out and read a book or sit in the Jacuzzi.

From Los Angeles, head North on I-5 approx. 310 miles, transferring to the I-580 West toward San Francisco. Continue approx. 60 miles until just before the Bay Bridge. **DO NOT TAKE BAY BRIDGE!** Instead, take the I-80 East for a few miles, then transfer back onto the I-580 West following the signs to the San Rafael Bridge. Pay your toll at the bridge and continue a few more miles till you merge with US-101 North. Continue on the US-101 for approx. 30 miles (through the town of Santa Rosa). Exit at River Road (Russian River Resorts), turn left and stay on that road until you get to the town of Guerneville, approx. 22 miles.

Lake Casitas, Aug 11-13, 2006

You don't have to drive far to have

a fun and relaxing camping experience! Escape the daily grind of hectic life and join us for a weekend of fun and relaxation on 2700-acre Lake Casitas, nestled between the sandy beaches of the Ventura County coast and spectacular mountains towering over the Ojai Valley. Our four campsites are lakeside, close enough to hear the lapping water of the sparkling lake.

A biking and hiking trail follows the east shoreline, perfect for a leisurely stroll or bike ride away from the campgrounds and a great place for scenic and wildlife photography. And if you like paddling a canoe or kayak, this is the place for you. We will also play a game or two of Frisbee Golf, an addictive game based on the rules of ball golf, but using flying disks thrown towards targets. Trust me - it's fun! Construction was just completed on brand new Coyote Point Disc Golf Course at Lake Casitas.

The nearby town of Ojai is charming and vibrant, filled with delightful shops and galleries.

Amenities: Picnic tables, fire rings, and water spigots. Hot showers are available. Park Store is well-stocked and offers groceries, ice, propane, wood and camping supplies. Various types of bicycles are available for rent, including mountain bikes, quadricycles, tandem bikes, etc. Watercraft such as patio deck boats, canoes, kayaks, and paddleboats are available.

Other Info: RVs up to 22' are welcome at our sites, however there are no hookups. Pets are allowed but must be leashed at all times. Check-in time is 3pm.

Weather will be warm during the day and most likely warm at night.

Proposed Weekend Schedule

Friday afternoon/evening: Arrive at Lake Casitas, set up tent, enjoy game night and campfire.

Saturday morning/afternoon: Breakfast at camp. Hike/bike, rent watercraft, play Frisbee golf, or visit Ojai. Evening is traditional Great Outdoors potluck, bring food for six people. Game night and campfire cap off evening.

Sunday morning: Breakfast at camp. Choose an activity that you didn't do the previous day. Pack out by noon.

Directions: From the South (Los Angeles) 101 Freeway North to Ventura. Take 33 Freeway towards Ojai. After approx. 10 miles from the 101, turn left onto Hwy 150 (Baldwin Road). Go West on Hwy 150 for approx. 3 miles. Turn left at Santa Ana Rd. Entrance to Lake is 100 yds on the right.

From the North (Santa Barbara) 101 Freeway South to Carpentry. Take Hwy 150 directly to Lake Casitas. Turn right on Santa Ana Rd. Entrance to Lake is 100 yds on the right.

Proceed to Grebe Campground, 1.5 miles from gate, sites 19, 20, 21, 22.

Parking: PLEASE carpool. First 4 cars park free, each additional car is \$10/night (driver responsible).

Cost is \$30 for members, \$45 for non-members. Registration deadline is August 10, 2006.

Getty Villa - Saturday, August 5, 2006

After being closed for many years, and an expenditure of some \$250 million in renovation and additions, the Getty Villa has recently re-opened.

On Saturday, August 5th, GO will be visiting the Villa, located at 17985 Pacific Coast Highway, Pacific Palisades (1 mile North of Sunset Blvd. on Hwy. 1).

The Villa is a reconstruction of a Roman country house based on actual measurements of an existing one in Italy. It exhibits a treasure of Greek and Roman antiquities in the form of sculptures and ceramics, but also includes mosaics, paintings, jewelry, glass, etc.

For some of you, there will be a disappointment that the rococo rooms are no longer housed there, but you may find them at the Getty Center. This building is absolutely beautiful, as are the classical gardens that surround it. We have 20 tickets and are limited to six parking spaces, each costing \$7, so we will all chip in to cover that cost.

We'll meet at 12 noon at a shopping center in Carpentaria for carpooling. From the North, take the Casitas Pass exit, turn Right, and you'll see the shopping center on the left. It is important to be on time, and we must arrive at the Villa between 1:30 and 2:00.

You'll recognize the group as we'll all be wearing Roman togas (joke!)



Bryce Canyon National Park, Utah by Jean-Guy and Paul


