PISMO BEACH SAND DUNES • February 26-28

Hello all, let's kick up some sand!

Join us for a fun filled weekend on the Dunes of Pismo Beach. The sea of sand, nestled next to the beauty that is our Pacific Coast, leaves one feeling cradled by Mother Nature while the fluttering wing of earth's angels, the Monarch butterflies in their annual migration, makes the experience surreal.

The closely packed sands of Pismo Beach offer themselves to the perfect rugged off-roading adventure with rolling dunes to satisfy the adventurer in us all. Come enjoy the last remaining coastal sand dunes open to Off-Highway Vehicles, formerly known as Pismo Beach. There are about 3,500 acres in the SVRA, with



2,000 set aside as buffer/preserve. The prevailing winds that blow in from the ocean push sand particles up into wave-like crests that run north-south creating the perfect off-road terrain.

The "Butterfly Trees" of Pismo Beach are one of our most beloved attractions from late October through February;



thousands of colorful Monarch butterflies cluster in the limbs of Eucalyptus and

Monterey Pines in the area, giving the appearance of yellow and orange leaves. They travel over the Sierra Mountains and west of the Rockies. Some come from as far away as Canada to escape the colder temperatures of the north.

Whitewater Rafting

Cal-Salmon River • May 7-8

The Wild and Scenic California Salmon River, although still somewhat unknown even in its home state of California, is one of the most incredible whitewater rafting trips in the country. It combines beautiful, lush coastal scenery, an intimate marble-smooth granite inner gorge, a seemingly endless number of side-creek waterfalls cascading in from above, emerald-green waters, tons of wildlife, and unequalled class IV-V pool-drop whitewater. This is truly a world-class, high-adventure whitewater run. Our excursion will be guided by Wilderness Adventures, who proved to be an excellent outfitter the last two years they guided Great Outdoors.



The lushness of the canyon is a refreshing change from the dryer, more desert-like landscape of many California rivers. Also outstanding is the abundance of wildlife; it is not uncommon to see black bear, the occasional mountain lion or wild horses, and meeting with deer and a wide range of birds is almost a given. We will be there during the peak of the wildflowers. The combination of stunning scenery and remote location lends itself to

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Sedgwick Ranch Day Hike & Pot Luck

Sunday, January 24

Encompassing almost 6,000 acres in the Santa Ynez Valley, the Sedgwick Reserve spans an elevational range of 1,300 feet and is noted for both its large size and environmental heterogeneity. It contains a major geologic fault system and two distinctive geologic formations: relatively young Paso Robles alluvium and much older Franciscan metamorphosed seafloor, including large areas of serpentine. Diverse vegetation types include: coast live oak forest, blue oak woodland, valley oak savannah, ceanothus chaparral, coastal sage scrub, grassland, willow riparian forest, and agricultural lands. The site contains major portions of two watersheds and a variety of localized wetland habitats, notably vernal pools. The region has a rich Native American heritage, and at least one Middle Chumash village (1,500 to 2,000 years old) rests on site.

The Sedgwick Reserve is part of the University of California "Natural Reserve System" and is located in the Santa Ynez mountains near Figueroa Mountain. Our day at the reserve is somewhat special since admission is not open to the public and is limited to researchers and school field trips and other approved community groups (like us!). Former home of socialite/actress Edie Sedgwick (who starred in several Andy Warhol films of the 1960s), the Sedgwick family estate has a sordid history including a philandering father, children who were banished to the bunkhouse, and perhaps even a haunted house.

The moderately difficult hike will be "family-friendly" and docent-led, providing an introduction to the plant life, wildlife, landscape, and geology of this former private ranch. We will begin gathering at 9:30 AM for the two-hour hike. A picnic lunch will be held when we return to the main house of the ranch (at around 12:30). Please bring a side dish or dessert to share. A

Where: Sedgwick Ranch, off Brinkerhoff Road, Santa Ynez

Date: Sunday, January 24.

Directions to Sedgwick Reserve from Santa Barbara or Lompoc: Take either State Route 154 (Cachuma Lake) or U.S. 101. If coming via 101, exit at the Buellton, State Route 246 exit and turn east (toward Solvang). Drive through Solvang and Santa Ynez to 154. Turn left at 154.

Going north on 154 look for Edison Rd (2.2 miles past 246), turn right on Edison (landmark is gray Lutheran church), go 1.1 miles to Roblar and turn right. Go 1.2 miles to Brinkerhoff and turn left (landmark is row of evergreen trees). Follow Brinkerhoff 2.4 miles to the end of the road and enter through the open gate. Follow signs to parking area.

creating a feeling of being set down in a different part of the world. You quickly become immersed in the area and the experience. The canyon's beauty is so stunning that it is protected by congress as a National Wild and Scenic River. Even if you took away the scenery and location, the whitewater would still make the river more than worthwhile. The rapids are an amazing combination of crashing waves, big holes and boulders, and clean steep drops over smooth granite. And, there are a ton of them!



The first day of the trip will begin on the Class IV stretch from Butler Creek to Oak Bottom. With rapids like Butler's Ledge, Double Drop, Contusion, Gaping Maw, and Wooley Booley this section will be a warm up to the Class V stretch on the second day. Our lunchtime will be split between eating a delicious meal and enjoying the amazing views that surround us. Further down river we will stop at a gorgeous campsite and you will have time to set up your sleeping site, fish, swim, or relax. The evening meal will be followed by dessert, campfire entertainment, and an incredible night under the stars. In the morning you will wake to the wonderful smell of coffee and breakfast. After another hearty gourmet meal we will be off to (king of all rapids) Freight Train whose raging waters you

can hear from afar. Running several Class IV & V rapids is only part of this impressive day. We will serve lunch at beautiful side stream before heading off to the take-out where you will be able to enjoy pictures taken by a local photographer.

Wednesday, May 5:

Optional travel day.

Thursday, May 6:

Travel day to Northern California, or if you arrived earlier, this is a free day to explore this stunning area. Suggestions in Humboldt County include Redwoods National Park, Avenue of the Giants, Eureka, and Trinity National Forest. Free camping at Nordheimer Camp is available, which will be our rafting campground for the weekend.

Friday, May 7:

Be at Somes Bar General Store by 8:00 AM to meet the river guides, then our rafting action begins! Gourmet lunch and dinner prepared by the river guides, campfire at night, enjoy the starry skies.

Saturday, May 8:

Breakfast cooked by guides. More rafting and another prepared gourmet lunch, more rafting. Trip ends late afternoon. Travel back home or stay an extra night to explore more of the area.

Sunday, May 9:

Optional travel day back home.

Directions will be given upon registration. Meeting place is the remote community of Somes Bar, CA in Humboldt County.

This guided rafting trip and river side camping will be Great Outdoors group ONLY! This is an all-inclusive rafting trip. Cost: \$340 per person (**\$75 deposit due by February 28 balance due by April 1, 2010**) 24-person maximum. Please call Chris for availability even after due date. We can probably fit you in if we haven't reached capacity.

You DO NOT need to have any previous river rafting experience. This is a class IV+ suitable for the experienced AND beginners in good physical condition, looking for a REAL Adventure! You will have a safety life vest, so if you can't swim, you'll be okay!

Upon registering for this trip, you will receive a complete package with all the info and instructions you'll need, including a list of inexpensive hotels/campgrounds for Wednesday/Thursday night.


